

## Parkway meeting attracts crowd

About 250 people attended a public meeting Tuesday evening at which three alternate routes for the proposed Heartland Parkway were unveiled.

Kentucky Transportation Cabinet officials presented the final conceptual alternatives for the Heartland Parkway before a packed house at Taylor County High School.

The 60-mile Heartland Parkway will connect the Louie B. Nunn Parkway at Columbia with the Martha Layne Collins Bluegrass Parkway at Springfield by widening the existing KY 55/U.S. 68/KY 555 route to four lanes. Locally, the project includes widening KY 210 from U.S. 68 to KY 3183 and widening KY 55 to five lanes from KY 1625 to U.S. 68.

While the proposals generally stick to the existing KY 55 route, alternatives do stray from the state road in a few spots around Elk Horn Road and Airport Road.

At the meeting, those who attended were given surveys to complete that would indicate their preference among the alternatives.

Transportation Cabinet official David Lindeman encouraged everyone to complete the surveys. Public input, he said, will be a large factor in the decision-making process.

The next step would be to refine the design, Lindeman said, and begin environmental studies.

Approval of the environmental assessment is expected by May 2011, after which a fourth round of public meetings will take place.

The Federal Highway Administration is expected to approve the final plan by August 2012.

No funding has been allocated for final design, purchase of rights of way, relocating utilities or construction, Lindeman said.
